#### FIRST READING: Jeremiah 31:7-14

#### The people sit.

A Reading from the book of the prophet Jeremiah.

<sup>7</sup>Thus says the LORD: "Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob. and raise shouts for the chief of the nations: proclaim, give praise, and say, 'Save, O LORD, your people, the remnant of Israel.' <sup>8</sup>See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north, and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth, among them the blind and the lame, those with child and those in labor, together; a great company, they shall return here. <sup>9</sup>With weeping they shall come, and with consolations I will lead them back. I will let them walk by brooks of water, in a straight path in which they shall not stumble; for I have become a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn. <sup>10</sup>Hear the word of the LORD, O nations, and declare it in the coastlands far away; sav, 'He who scattered Israel will gather him, and will keep him as a shepherd a flock.' <sup>11</sup>For the LORD has ransomed Jacob.

#### **THE SERMON**

### THE REV. SALLY HERRING

#### THE CREED (BCP p. 358)

All stand as they are able.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God. begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead. and the life of the world to come. Amen.

#### THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE (BCP p. 359)

All remain standing.

Father, we pray for your holy catholic Church; *That we all may be one*.

Grant that every member of the Church may truly and humbly serve you; *That your Name may be glorified by all people*.

We pray for all bishops, priests, and deacons. We especially pray for our Presiding Bishop, Michael Curry and our bishop, Glenda Curry. We pray for our Companion Diocese of the Virgin Islands as they discern the selection of a new bishop. We also pray for all Diocesan Youth Ministries, for St. John's, Decatur, St. John's, Montgomery, St. John's in the Prairie, Forkland, Epiphany, Guntersville, Epiphany, Leeds and Epiphany, Tallassee;

That they may be faithful ministers of your Word and Sacraments.

We pray for all who govern and hold authority in the nations of the world; *That there may be justice and peace on the earth.* 

Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake; *That our works may find favor in your sight*.

Have compassion on those who suffer from any grief or trouble. In our own parish we pray for Beth, Nita, Clydene, Law, Mary Lynn, Laurie, Jeff, Amy, Rebecca, Tim, Doug, Connie, Perri, Mason, Mary, Arabella, Christian, Bailey, Vicky, Liz, Joe, Charlie, Clyde, Marie, the Family of Michelle and Steve Landrum and Teresa.

That they may be delivered from their distress.

We also pray for all of those who serve in the military, especially John Morris. *That they may serve faithfully, with sure confidence that God is at their side.* 

Give to the departed eternal rest; We especially remember Jimmy, cousin of Steve Landrum.

O God whose mercies cannot be numbered: Accept our prayers on behalf of your servant Jimmy, and grant him an entrance into the land of light and joy, in the fellowship of your saints; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

Let light perpetual shine upon them.

We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy; May we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.

Let us pray for our own needs and those of others.

Confession of Sin (BCP p. 359)

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

## Silence may be kept.

#### Minister and People

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

#### The Priest stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. *Amen*.

#### THE PEACE (BCP p. 360) All stand.

#### The Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with [\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ and] all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.

This is the table not of the church but of the Lord. It is made ready for those who Love him and for those who wish to love him more. So come, you who have much faith and you who have little; you who have been here often and you who have not been here long; you who have tried to follow and you who have failed. Come, because it is the Lord who invites you. It is the Lord's will that those who seek Him should meet Him here.

## **DISTRIBUTION (BCP p. 365)**

The ministers receive the Sacrament in both kinds, and then immediately deliver it to the people.

The Bread and the Cup are given to the communicants with these words

The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven. [Amen.]

The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation. [Amen.]

#### **POST-COMMUNION PRAYER (BCP p. 365)**

After Communion, the Celebrant says

Let us pray.

#### Celebrant and People

Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. **Outreach** – The items that have been collected for the women and their children at King's Home Ranch will be taken on Thursday, January 6<sup>th</sup>, the Epiphany of Our Lord Jesus Christ. All those who would like to go please meet at the church. Time to be announced.

**Stewardship** – Thank you to all of those who have already completed and submitted their 2022 pledge. If you have not returned your pledge card, please complete one and return as soon as possible. Extra pledge cards are available.

**Epiphany** – The Church recognizes January 6<sup>th</sup> as the Epiphany of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. On this day the significance of Jesus' birth was revealed to the world by the visit of the magi, or the three wise men from the east; who, guided by a star, came to worship the child born to be a king. In this one event we find the fulfillment of both the Hebrew Scriptures prophecy and the dreams of many peoples. From the Middle Ages it has been a tradition to pray for God's blessing on our dwelling places, marking with chalk the entrance to our home with the initials of the three wise men and the current year: 20 Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar 22. This serves as a sign to all who visit that those who come seeking Christ are welcome. There are packets of chalk and a copy of the Blessing of a Home to take home with you. Please take pictures of your blessing and marking of your home to share on the church's face book page.

**Baptism** – We will celebrate the Baptism of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on Sunday January 9. This is the day in the life of the church that we recognize as the date of Our Lord's baptism, one of the days when the church traditionally holds baptisms.
