Instructions for Altar Guild

Purpose: Members of the Altar Guild prepare the altar for Sunday services and for special services throughout the year. Note: the following is a brief overview of Altar Guild responsibilities. A more complete detailing of these responsibilities and training for Altar Guild can be obtained from Altar Guild chair, Cathy Cawthon

Before the service:

• Make certain the correct hangings are on the altar. Check the liturgical calendar in the Sacristy for correct color of hangings.

• When preparing for Sunday services first set up for the Folk Mass (if offered) held at 8:00am on Sunday morning. For this service pottery is used and the following should be placed on the Credence table:

- Chalice stack including Chalice, Pall, Paten with small wafer, Purificator and Corporal

- Small bread box
- Cruet filled with wine
- Cruet filled with water
- Also prepare for the 10:00am service. Silver is used for this service
- Place the "Alms and Oblations" (bread and wine) in the Narthex

- Assemble the Chalice stack and leave in the Sacristy. Refer to the photograph in Sacristy for guidance in assembling the stack.

- Place large wafer on the Paten

• Also leave in the Sacristy for the 10:00am service

- Cruet with water
- Lavabo bowl with Lavabo towel
- Small Chalice with Paten and Purificator

- Between the two Sunday morning services:
- Remove items used during the Folk Mass from the Credence Table and return them to the Sacristy.
- Place the items to be used for the 10:00am Eucharist on the Credence Table using photograph in the Sacristy as a guide.

• After the Service:

- Remove all items from the Credence Table and return to the Sacristy
- Consume any remaining wafers that have been blessed
- You may either consume remaining blessed wine or you may pour it onto the ground
- Wash and dry chalices, cruets, and patens. Return silver to proper storage bags Place on shelves in the sacristy.
- Spot clean used linens. Take home to wash and iron.
- Straighten sacristy and lock door upon leaving.
